Batavia Public School District 101 (BPS101) operates as a Unit District serving pre-kindergarten through 12th grade. BPS101 partners in education with the Fox Valley Career Center, Mid-Valley Special Education Cooperative, and Waubonsee Community College (WCC). Through WCC, BPS101 offers post-secondary experiences in a Manufacturing Cohort and Dual Credit Coursework. The estimated population of the District was more than 32,000 residents in 2020, with the majority located within the City of Batavia in Kane County, Illinois, and the balance in small portions of the cities of Aurora, North Aurora, and Geneva. The District encompasses approximately 19 square miles of land, primarily within Batavia Township, and is situated approximately 35 miles west of Chicago.
